Methodism was very important in 19th century Shetland. Thanks to missionary efforts by Shetlanders, and by Methodist visitors, the creed had more adherents per head of population here than elsewhere in Scotland.

David Bebbington, Professor of History at the University of Stirling, has written about the broader Evangelical movement throughout Britain and particularly the Baptists in Scotland. He is now researching Methodism in the Victorian period and has worked on Methodist archives in the Shetland Museum and Archives.

David will be speaking about what the Methodists did in Shetland during the Victorian period – and outlining some of his discoveries.
